Water Wisely This Spring and Summer

Despite recent rains, we continue to remain under a Level 2 Drought condition. With spring in full bloom and summer on the way, watching your water consumption and watering wisely can help conserve water and save money on your utility bill at the same time.

Here are a few ways you can accomplish both:

- Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. A taller lawn shades roots and holds moisture better than a shorter lawn.
- Avoid watering your lawn on windy days when most of the water blows away or evaporates.
- Check your sprinkler system for leaks and broken sprinkler heads and repair promptly, if necessary.
- Adjust sprinkler heads, if necessary, to prevent over spraying on sidewalks and roadways.

- Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Soaker hoses disperse water into the soil more efficiently.
- Aerate your lawn at least once a year so water can reach the roots instead of running off the surface.

Remember, one of the best ways to conserve water outdoors is to take advantage of spring and summer rains. A vegetable garden generally requires about an inch of rain a week to do well. You may be able to skip a watering if we've had a good rain shower. To minimize evaporation, water your lawn and garden in the morning when temperatures are cooler.
