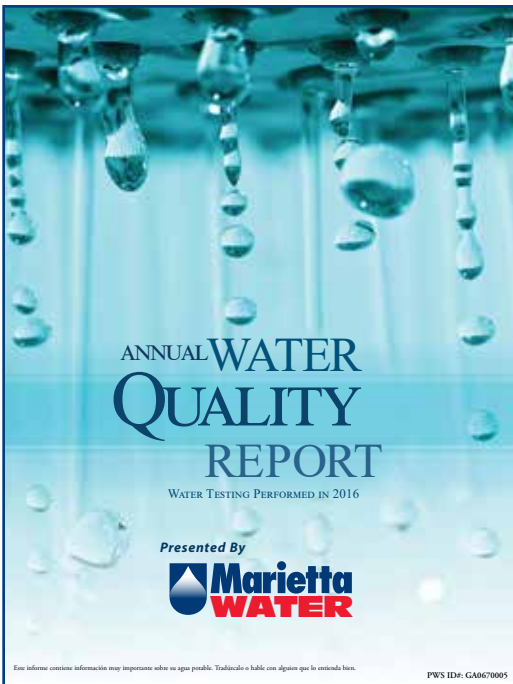

Marietta Power and Water are Proud to Present Our Annual Water Quality Report




Safe drinking water is critical to the physical and economic health of our community. The delivery of high quality, safe drinking water is our mission. Achieving and maintaining water quality through the treatment and conveyance is an intricate and complex process. Each year we compile an annual Water Quality Report with data describing our perpetual evaluation of your drinking water quality. We hope that providing you with this report will impart confidence in the safety and quality of your drinking water.

Marietta Power and Water's new Water Quality Report is now available on our website and contains details of the drinking water testing that was performed between January 1 and December 31, 2016. Our water is continually monitored for quality control and assurance, both at the treatment plant and in the distribution system. Thousands of water samples are taken and tested each year to monitor for substances such as pesticides, herbicides, microbial, organic and inorganic contaminants. This monitoring, once again, confirms that your water supply meets or exceeds all state and federal drinking water standards.

"Our staff continues to work hard every day—at any hour—to deliver the highest quality drinking water without interruption. This report meets the federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requirements for the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) and contains information on the source of our water, its constituents, and the health risks associated with any contaminants."

The Water Quality Report includes specific information about lead and copper monitoring. Due to low levels of lead and copper historically found in our service area (and an associated low level of risk for lead and copper contamination), the Cobb County–Marietta Water Authority and Marietta Water are required to submit samples collected at customer taps to the state only once every three years. The next round of sampling is scheduled for this year, 2017.

Marietta Power and Water joins more than 220 public power utilities nationwide that hold the RP3 designation.
