Water conservation can be easy if it becomes a habit. If you follow these simple steps, you'll find it is easier than ever to reduce water use and save money on your energy bill at the same time.

Check for leaks regularly. Small water leaks can add up to gallons of water lost daily. There are a few easy ways to check for water leaks on an ongoing basis:

1. **Monitor your water bill.** If your water bill is slowly increasing, but your water usage habits have stayed the same, you may have a water leak.
2. **Watch for drips.** Place a glass under your water faucet overnight. If you wake up and there is water in the glass, you have a leak.
3. **Test your toilet.** Test your toilet for leaks by adding a few drops of food coloring to your toilet tank, then wait 30 minutes. If the color shows up in your bowl, then you have a leak that is allowing water to flow from the tank to your drain without ever flushing the bowl.

In the Bathroom

Over half of the water you use in the home is in the bathroom.

- Turn off the tap while shaving or brushing your teeth.
- Showers use less water than baths. If possible, keep your shower time to 10 minutes or less. If you are able to cut your shower time by 2 minutes, you can save up to 10 gallons of water.

In the Kitchen

- If washing dishes by hand, use a sink stopper or a wash basin so you are not running water.
- If washing your dishes in a dishwasher, make sure the dishwasher is fully loaded.

- Keeping a pitcher of drinking water in the refrigerator will eliminate running the water until it is cold.

In the Laundry Room

- When possible, wash only full loads of laundry. If your washer has water level settings, adjust your settings based on load size.
- To save money on your energy bills, set your washing machine to use cold water rather than hot or warm water.
