CALCULATE THE ENERGY COST FOR YOUR HOME ENTERTAINMENT DEVICES

Customers on a quest to reduce their energy usage will appreciate the Marietta Power and Water Television Calculator. The TV Calculator is easy to use and helps you calculate your TV, Cable box, DVD/ DVR and Game Console energy usage and costs.

To use this handy calculator, visit www.mariettapowerandwater.com and click on the Residential tab in the top navigation bar. Once on the Residential page, click on Power, then Residential

Energy Calculator. The TV Calculator is one of six calculators available to our residential customers.

Click on the TV Calculator icon and start your query. The calculator gives you the option to calculate the energy usage and cost when your devices are being used or when they are just plugged in.

By entering basic information about your entertainment devices, the calculator easily estimates your energy usage and costs. In just a few clicks, you can adjust the usage time and number of devices to see the savings to your energy bill if you were to use your entertainment devices less or eliminate one altogether.

Follow these simple steps:

1. Select the type and screen size of your TV
2. Determine total weekday use, then weekend use.
3. As you add each entertainment device, the energy usage and costs update in real time.

Best Practices for Winter Watering



As the temperatures cool, it's important to know exactly how much water your plants need before you turn on the sprinkler. Smart watering practices reduce runoff and may decrease the need for pesticides and fertilizers.


These tips will help keep your lawn green and your water consumption and utility bill down:

1. When using a sprinkler, monitor the amount of time you water. If water begins to pool, turn off your sprinkler to prevent overwatering and weed growth. Watering plants or grass too frequently can drown plants or result in shallow roots.
2. The quickest way to reduce water waste is to locate and repair existing leaks. Be sure to inspect all exterior fixtures, as well as basements and crawlspaces if applicable.

3. When temperatures drop below 32 degrees, exposed water pipes can freeze. To reduce the likelihood of freezing, wrap water pipes in unheated areas with insulation tubes.
4. In the event your property experiences a catastrophic water leak, knowing the location of your shut-off valve could save you money on water and damage repairs.
5. During any season, Georgians must still follow the non-drought outdoor water use schedule required in the Water Stewardship Act of 2010. This law allows all types of outdoor water use, but landscape watering should only take place before 10 a.m. and after 4 p.m. daily. This is done to limit evaporation during the warmest part of the day.
