Celebrate Fire Safety This October



Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors should be checked on a monthly basis. If you have not checked either device in a while, then October is a great month to start. In celebration of National Fire Prevention Month, Marietta Power and Water would like to share the following smoke and carbon monoxide detector safety tips.

- If your fire alarm is making a continuous set of three loud beeps, it has detected smoke or fire in your home. Get out of your home as quickly as possible, call 911, and stay out.
- A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be replaced.

- All smoke alarms must be replaced every 10 years.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.
- Make sure your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors meet the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.

Follow These Guidelines for Safer Cooking in Your Home

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), cooking fires are the leading cause of home fires by far, accounting for 48% of all reported residential fires.

Taking a few simple precautions can greatly reduce the risk of cooking fires.

- Never leave the kitchen while cooking. Unattended cooking is the number one cause of cooking fires.
- Do not wear loose-fitting clothing while cooking. Loose-fitting sleeves or shirts can easily catch on fire.

- Clean cooking surfaces regularly to prevent food and grease build-up.
- Keep pot holders, towels and curtains away from hot surfaces.
- Store flammable solvents and cleaners away from all heat sources.
- Never store gasoline inside the home.
- Turn pan handles inward to prevent food spills and move them out of reach of children.
