Sign Up to Receive Power Outage Notifications

Marietta Power and Water is committed to safely delivering reliable power to our customers. On occasion, storms and weather events can cause your power to flicker or shut off completely. Because of this, we have developed power outage and restoration notifications sent to you by text and email that are personalized especially for you!

Our outage alerts inform you when there is an outage at your service address and continue to update you as we work to restore your power. If your mobile phone number and email address are on file with Marietta Power and Water, you will receive customized alerts.


To receive these notifications, simply update your phone number or email address on our customer outage notification portal.

1. Visit www.mariettaga.gov/outagenotifications.
2. Validate your account by entering the following information found on your utility bill:
 - a. Customer Number (ex: 123456)
 - b. Location Number (ex: 12345)
 - c. Cycle and Route Numbers

It's that simple! Marietta Power and Water can now send you alerts to notify you of outages at your address. We will also send an alert when the power has been restored.

Simple Ways to Prepare for Cooler Weather

High heating bills can really impact your monthly budget. Here are a few simple tips that can help you prepare in advance for cooler weather.

- Inspect the ductwork in your attic and crawlspace to ensure it has not become obstructed or disconnected.
- Change your furnace filter. Filters should be changed every 90 days.
- When you're not using your fireplace, make sure to close the damper.
- Caulk and use weather stripping to prevent air leaks around windows and doors.

- Programmable thermostats can be set to automatically lower the temperature at night while you are sleeping and during times when you and your family are usually away from home.
- Hire a professional heating contractor and ask them to check your heating equipment, test ductwork, and seal leaks.
