





Safe drinking water is critical to the physical and economic health of our community. The delivery of high quality, safe drinking water is our mission. Achieving and maintaining water quality through

treatment and conveyance is an intricate and complex process. Each year, we compile an annual Water Quality Report with data describing our perpetual evaluation of your drinking water quality. We hope that providing you with this report will impart confidence in the safety and quality of your drinking water.

Marietta Power and Water's new Water Quality Report is now available on our website and contains details of the drinking water testing that was performed between January 1 and December 31, 2021. Our water is continually monitored for quality control and assurance, both at the treatment plant and in the distribution system. Thousands of water samples are taken and tested each year to monitor for substances such as pesticides, herbicides, microbial, organic, and inorganic contaminants. This monitoring once again confirms that your water supply meets or exceeds all state and federal drinking water standards.

"Our staff continues to work hard every day—at any hour—to deliver the highest quality drinking water without interruption. The report meets the federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requirements for the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) and contains information on the source of our water, its constituents, and the health risks associated with any contaminants." said Tim Marshall, Marietta Power and Water's Environmental Compliance Coordinator.
