Use Space Heaters Wisely

Space heaters are a terrific way to supplement your regular heating system. If used correctly, they can keep your family warm and safe all winter long. According to the National Fire Protection Association, space heaters are also involved in many home fires.

When using a space heater, follow these simple precautions:

- Purchase a portable space heater certified for safe operation by the Underwriter's Laboratory (UL) or another nationally-recognized testing organization.
- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from the space heater. This includes children and pets, as well as bedding, furniture, and drapes. Do not place heaters where towels or other objects could fall on the heater and start a fire.
- Place the heater on a level, hard, non-flammable surface. Do not attempt to use electric heaters in wet places, such as a bathroom, unless they are certified for that purpose. Corrosion or damage to heater parts may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Turn off the heater when leaving a room or going to bed. Children should not be permitted to adjust the controls or move the heater.
- Plug only one space heater into an electric outlet at a time. Avoid using extension cords and never hide cords under rugs or carpets. Do not attempt to operate a damaged space heater.

Prepare Your Garden for the Warmer Weather Now


Although the ground may still be frozen, plant the seeds now for big water savings this spring. Whether you are gearing up for an annual flower bed or a vegetable garden, here is how you can get more done with less water.

- Check faucets and hose connections for leaks. A leak in an outside faucet can waste 170 gallons (about twice the volume of a bathtub) of water in 24 hours.
- Water hoses often use more water than necessary. A $\frac{5}{8}$ -inch hose carries more than 1,000 gallons in an hour. Reduce your garden hose size to half an inch for watering — it is lighter and provides about 600 gallons an hour.

- Use a nozzle that can be adjusted to fine spray. When you are finished watering, shut off the water at the house instead of at the nozzle to avoid leaks.
- Check your sprinklers to be sure they are properly adjusted and are watering your plants and not the sidewalk.
