that type of project can also be expensive. Luckily, there are a few inexpensive and easy-to-do measures that you can take to increase the efficiency of the windows you already have.

Add window treatments. Curtains, shades, and blinds can reduce the amount of heat from summer sunshine and can help keep heat in during the winter.

Weatherize your windows. By caulking around window frames on both the inside and outside of your home, you can reduce leaks and drafts due to small gaps or cracks.

If you decide to replace your windows, select units that are ENERGY STAR certified. ENERGY STAR windows are 15 percent more energy efficient than standard models.
