Conserve Water this Winter

After months of little to no rainfall, Marietta Power and Water encourages you to take measures to limit your water use this winter.

You can conserve substantial amounts of water if you:

Check for Leaks. There are some easy ways to look for leaks in your house. Watermarks on floors, walls, or ceilings can indicate indoor pipe leakage. Standing water on the ground or pavement when there has been no rain can indicate a broken underground pipe. Fixing these leaks will save water as well as lower your utility bill.

Check for toilet leaks. Add food color or dye to your toilet tank. Wait 30 minutes. Do not flush the toilet during this time. If the water in the bowl changes color, you have a leak. To determine which part of the toilet is the problem, draw a line inside the tank at the water level. Turn off the water supply to the toilet. Wait another 30 minutes. If the water level stays the same, the leak is the refill valve or float. If the water level drops below the line, the problem is the flush valve or flapper.



Change the faucet and showerheads. Your current fixtures may not be very efficient. If your showerhead uses more than 2.5 Gallons per Minute (GPM), you could save water by replacing it with a new low-flow showerhead. Low-flow showerheads conserve water by mixing air with water to reduce the amount of water, but still feel like higher-flowing fixtures. If your faucets (bathroom, kitchen, or other) use more than 2.0 GPM, consider changing your existing aerator.

Seal Leaks and Save Money


Areas that leak air into and out of your home can cost you a lot of money. Simple fixes include installing weather stripping on doors and caulking around windows, while bigger jobs might include sealing leaks and adding insulation in your attic.

- Test your home for air tightness. On a windy day, carefully hold a lit candle or a match next to your windows, doors, electrical boxes, plumbing fixtures, electrical outlets, ceiling fixtures, attic hatches, and other places where air may leak. If the flame travels horizontally, you have located an air leak that may need caulking, sealing, or weather stripping.
- Cover single-pane windows with storm windows or replace them with more efficient double-pane low-emissivity windows.
- Use foam sealant on larger gaps around windows, baseboards, and other places where air may leak out.
- Replace door bottoms and thresholds with ones that have pliable sealing gaskets.
- Keep the fireplace flue damper tightly closed when not in use.
