## May is Electrical Safety Month

This year, celebrate National Electrical Safety Month by using this checklist to detect potential electrical troubles.

- Watch for household lights that dim or flicker. Also, make sure light bulbs are the appropriate wattage for the fixture size. Bulbs that are too high in wattage can lead to a fire through overheating.
- Wall outlets, switches, and switch plates should be in good working condition and cool to the touch. Consider Tamper Resistant Receptacles (TRRs) if there are small children in the home.
- Make sure all lamp cords are not worn or damaged and are unwrapped — tightly wrapped cords can overheat and burn.
- Use extension cords only temporarily — they are not as safe as permanent house wiring.
- Listen for crackling, sizzling, or buzzing from outlets.
- Frequently blown fuses and circuit breakers that trip often can indicate electrical wiring problems.



Consult a qualified electrician if you suspect any problems.

Other important safety measures include Arc Fault Circuit Interrupters (AFCIs) and Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs) that recognize fire hazards and shut off the power. # Do Not Pour F.O.G. Down the Drain



F.O.G. stands for fats, oils, and grease and can stick to the walls of your pipes and sewer system. This build-up over time can eventually block your plumbing and sewer system resulting in sewer overflows. F.O.G. can come from meats, cooking oils, dairy products, sauces, salad dressings, or marinades that go down the kitchen sink or get flushed down the toilet. Garbage disposals do not eliminate F.O.G., they merely chop it up into smaller pieces. All F.O.G. and food scraps should be thrown in the trash. Easy ways you can dispose of F.O.G.:

- Allow F.O.G. to cool. Pour any liquids into a sealable, disposable container and place them in the trash.
- Use a spatula or a similar utensil to scrape any solid F.O.G. and food particles into the trash.
- Use a paper towel to dry and wipe any remaining F.O.G. residue into the trash.
