June is National Safety Month

You and your family's safety are important. While statistics about home injuries are alarming, preventing them can be quite easy. Putting a plan in place to reduce the number of accidents can help you and your family prevent the most common home injuries. Some of the most common hazards at home include cuts, choking, electrical shock, falls, and burns.

Summer Watering Tips



Here are some simple ways to save on your water bill this summer.

- Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. A taller lawn shades roots and holds moisture better than a shorter lawn.
- Avoid watering your lawn on windy days when most of the water blows away or evaporates. Check your sprinkler system for leaks and broken heads and repair them promptly, if necessary. Adjust sprinkler heads to prevent overspray on sidewalks or roadways. Also, consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Soaker hoses more efficiently disperse water to the soil.

- Aerate your lawn at least once a year so water can reach the roots instead of running off the surface.
- Potted plants sitting on concrete or asphalt surfaces during hot weather will lose water more quickly. If possible, move containers away from these areas.

- Water container plants thoroughly until water seeps from drainage holes. Thorough watering encourages deep roots resulting in less frequent watering needs. Apply water directly to the soil instead of showering foliage.
- Group plants with the same watering needs to avoid over-watering some and under-watering others.
- Use a layer of mulch on the surface of your planting beds to retain moisture and minimize weed growth that competes for water.

Remember, one of the best ways to conserve water outdoors is to take advantage of spring and summer rains. To view the current watering restrictions, visit MariettaGa.Gov/504/Water-Restrictions. ☀

Adjust Your Thermostat and Save

Slight changes can lead to substantial savings and the best part is you do not have to sacrifice comfort!

According to the U.S. Department of Energy, by setting your thermostat 10° higher or lower from its normal setting for eight hours daily, you can save approximately 10% on your annual energy costs. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temperatures, the lower your overall cooling bill. Although thermostats can be adjusted manually, programmable thermostats will allow you to set the temperature to adjust automatically.
