Prepare for Fall Weather

Summer may feel like it is here to stay, but fall is just around the corner. Now is the time to ready your home for fall’s cooler temperatures.

- **Check for drafts.** Stay warm, save energy, and reduce your heating bill this fall by examining your windows and doors. Check window and door frames for cracks. Fill them with caulk that contains silicone. Putty, rope-like caulk can help seal large cracks.

- **Check the heating system.** Inspect your home's heating vents to ensure they are not blocked or covered by furniture, carpeting, or curtains. Dust the vents and clean or replace your filters. It is also a good idea to make an appointment with a professional for an annual heating system check-up. That way, you are assured that you will have heat on that first cold night.
- **Clean the fireplace and chimney.** Before building that first fall fire, you should have your chimney cleaned. Ask the chimney cleaner to check the damper to ensure it can be tightly closed to prevent drafts and keep the heat inside.
- **Store air conditioners.** If you have removable window air conditioners, unplug them before taking them down. Also, dust and clean them before covering or storing them away.
