Prepare Now for Colder Weather

With winter officially here, it's the perfect time to make sure your home is ready for colder temperatures. A little preparation now can help keep you comfortable, lower your utility bills, and prevent costly repairs later. Here are a few simple steps to get started.

Step One: Seal Drafty Windows and Doors – Drafts allow warm air to escape and cold air to enter, increasing your energy bill by as much as 25 percent. Check all windows and doors and seal any gaps using weatherstripping, foam tape, or fresh caulk. Don't forget to look for drafts around your chimney and seal any openings there as well.

Step Two: Protect Your Water Pipes – Freezing temperatures can cause pipes to freeze and even burst. Insulate any pipes located near exterior walls, in crawl spaces, or in unheated areas of your home using pipe insulation or heating tape. During freezing conditions, check your faucets for water flow and pressure before going to bed and again in the morning.

Step Three: Prepare Exterior Plumbing – Disconnect garden hoses and install covers on all outdoor faucets. If you'll be away from home for an extended time, turn off your water completely. Take a moment to locate your main water valve and the valve on your water heater—knowing where they are can be extremely helpful in an emergency.

Simple Ways to Conserve Water this Winter



You can save a significant amount of water at home by making a few simple changes.

Check for Leaks – A quick inspection can reveal leaks you may not even know you have. Indoors, watch for dripping faucets, water marks on floors, walls, or ceilings—these often signal hidden pipe issues. Outdoors, unexplained puddles or standing water on pavement may indicate a broken underground line. Repairing leaks not only conserves water but can also lower your utility bill.

To test your toilet for leaks, add a few drops of food coloring or a dye tablet to the tank. Wait 30 minutes without flushing. If the water in the bowl changes color, you have a leak. To pinpoint the source, mark the water level inside the tank and turn off the water supply. After another 30 minutes, check the level again. If it hasn't changed, the refill valve or float is likely the issue. If the water level has dropped below your mark, the flush valve or flapper needs attention.

Update Faucets and Showerheads – Older fixtures may use more water than necessary. If your showerhead delivers more than 2.5 gallons per minute (GPM), consider replacing it with a low-flow model. These efficient showerheads mix air with water to reduce usage while still providing strong water pressure. Likewise, if your faucets run at more than 2.0 GPM, swapping out the aerator can make a noticeable difference.

More Easy Ways to Save

- Keep showers under five minutes.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Run dishwashers and washing machines only when full.
