

AN ORDINANCE

Amending Ordinance No. 4134, the Personnel Policy Ordinance of the City of Marietta, so as to establish a mandatory retirement age of seventy.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARIETTA, GEORGIA, THAT:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 4134, the Personnel Policy Ordinance of the City of Marietta, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be known as Section 16 of Article V, as follows:

"Section 16. Mandatory Retirement Age. Mandatory Retirement Age for all employees shall be seventy (70) years of age. The Chiefs of the Fire and Police Departments shall establish bonified occupational qualifications for members of their departments in order to assure the continued physical fitness and ability of such members to perform their duties. All members of the Fire and Police Departments forty (40) years of age or over and below the rank of Chief shall undergo testing at least once a year to occupational qualifications."

Section 2. It is hereby declared to be the intention of this ordinance that its sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases of this Ordinance.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature or without the signature of the Mayor, subject to Georgia laws 1983, page 4119.
